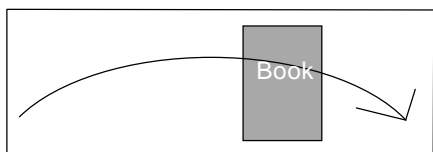


# Book Wrapping

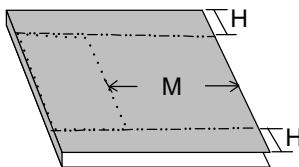

Designed on 12/28/2001 and diagrammed in 12/2001  
 This design has secure corner lock without glue

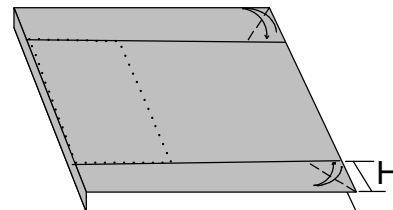
1. Start from a long wrapping paper; Paper width should be wider than book length; 10 cm (4in) wider could be a good start. Bring both short sides together to cover the book.



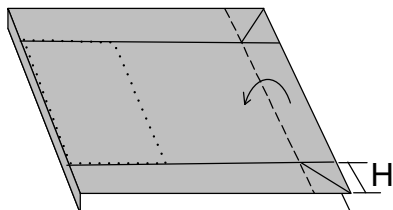
2. Move the book against the middle of the wrapped side; Crease along the book cover short edges. Distance between book edge and paper edge is H. Make sure distance M is at least 4H larger; Cut paper to make H shorter if necessary



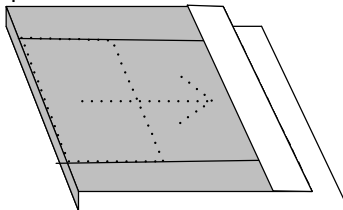
3. Enlarged; Bisect 2 corners



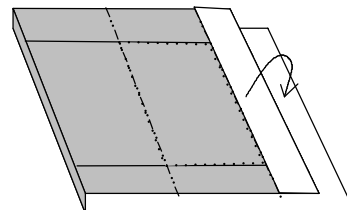

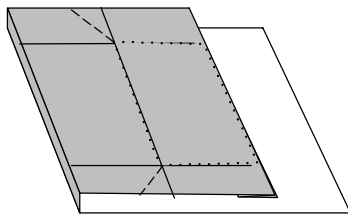
5. Move book to the new position



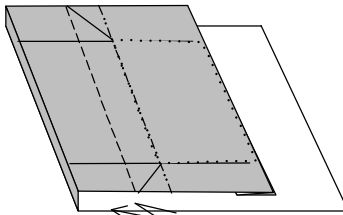
6. Crease along book cover long edge; Mountain fold right flap



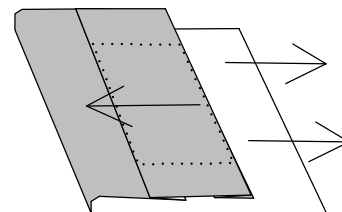
7. Angle bisecting



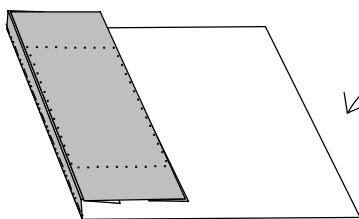
8. Pleat



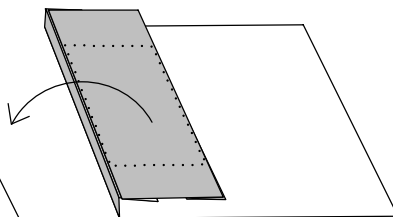
9. Pull bottom paper to wrap the book tight



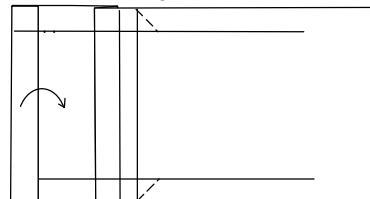
10. Crease along the bottom of book binding edge



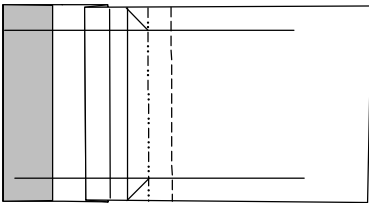
11. Unwrap and take book away



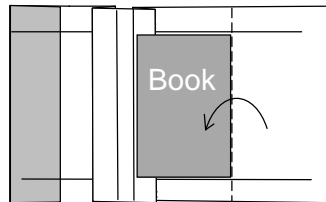
12. Bisect angles; Unfold left stripe



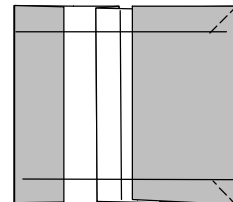
13. Pleat



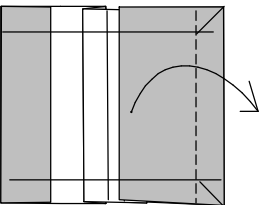
14. Put the book back; Align the book with the crease; Fold wrapping paper along the right book edge then move the book away.



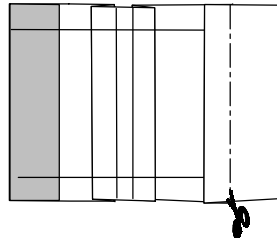
15. Angle bisecting



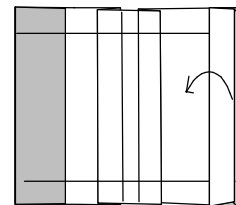

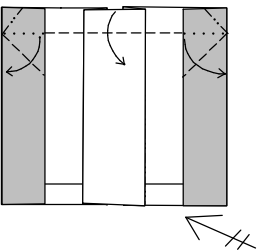
17. Cut off or fold in extra paper



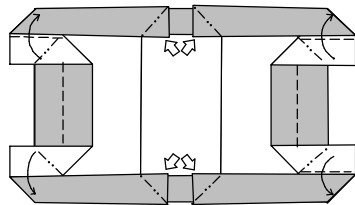
18. Unfold right flap



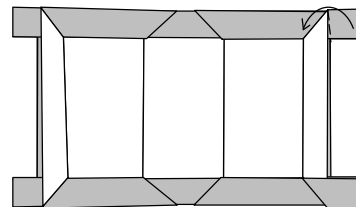
19. Repeat the other end



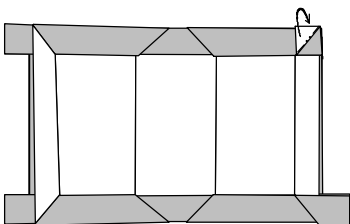
20. Enlarged; Inside reverse 4 corners in the middle.



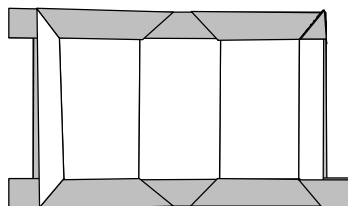

22. Mountain fold and tuck the triangular flap into pocket behind;



23. Repeat steps 21 and 22 for other 3 corners. This step locks all corners together.



24. Finished; Tuck book cover inside
